

CMCF Provides Key Funding to **Enhance School Safety**

In a school safety situation, each second counts. The short timeframe from notice of an incident to response doesn't provide teachers with much time to blockade the classroom door with bookshelves and desks, while also keeping the students calm and quiet. To address this critical need, the Central Montcalm Community Foundation (CMCF) made a significant investment toward the safety of the Central Montcalm Public School staff and students by supporting "The Boot™ - Adopt a Door" initiative.

From idea to reality, the project's timeline was rather short. After recently hearing about The Boot™ device at a school safety conference, representatives from the lower and upper elementary parent teacher groups, in coordination with school superintendent Amy Meinhardt, brought in a speaker from the Fowlerville-based Lockdown Company in May 2018. "We had an idea that we really wanted to deal with security during the next school year," preschool teacher and parent Tonia Reinke

essentially a small plate of industrial steel that can be placed in front of

a door to prevent people from entering by simple, one-step engagement.

When fully engaged as a door barricade, the Boot[™] can withstand 16,000

pounds of force- enhancing the lockdown strength and safety of nearly any door to keep danger out, and allow safety in. It is a rectangular-

shaped plate of 7/8 inch thick cold-rolled steel with steel pins and a

floor mounted steel sleeve that when fully engaged can withstand 16,000 pounds of pressure. The Boot™ weighs only 4.89 pounds and while it is

small, it is mighty when stopping entry from the danger that resides on

the other side of the door. A teacher just places it in front of the door and

activates it, giving them significantly more time to attend to students.

said. "After reaching out to Superintendent Amy Meinhardt, we came across this company and thought it looked like a great system." Shortly after this initial presentation, a community meeting about The Boot™ was convened in early June and a small group of parents officially launched an effort called "The Boot™ - Adopt a Door for Central Montcalm." The fundraising plan was clear but daunting: contact area businesses and individuals about sponsoring 183 doors at \$250 each raising \$45,000. However, to get on the company's installation list before a fall school start, at least half the funds were required in a very short time. After the Central Montcalm school board approved the strategy effort in late June, the group which had already begun raising funds moved forward full throttle.

Abby Gainey, the lower elementary representative for the group, approached the Central Montcalm Community Foundation in July to ask if they would support the project. "I was hoping they would sponsor a few doors," Gainey said. The Community Foundation decided to pay for 50 The Boot™ devices. "Abby came in and told us they had commitments for around 40 of The Boot™ devices, but that wasn't enough to get the company to start installing them," said Gale Parr of the CMCF. "Our mindset was that we wanted to get them to the halfway point so that they could start installing them before school starts in the fall."

Abby Gainey was so thrilled. "We'd gotten some great funding from local businesses and private donators, but this really blew us away and we're so thankful," Gainey said. "Seeing how much it meant to them honestly meant so much to us. They were all so enthused, passionate and interested in helping out, making it easy to see why this is such an important cause." Because of the CMCF's timely and generous donation, the Lockdown Company was able to successfully install all 183 The Boot™ devices before the start of the 2018-2019 school year, and the project met its total funding goal in about a month's time.


